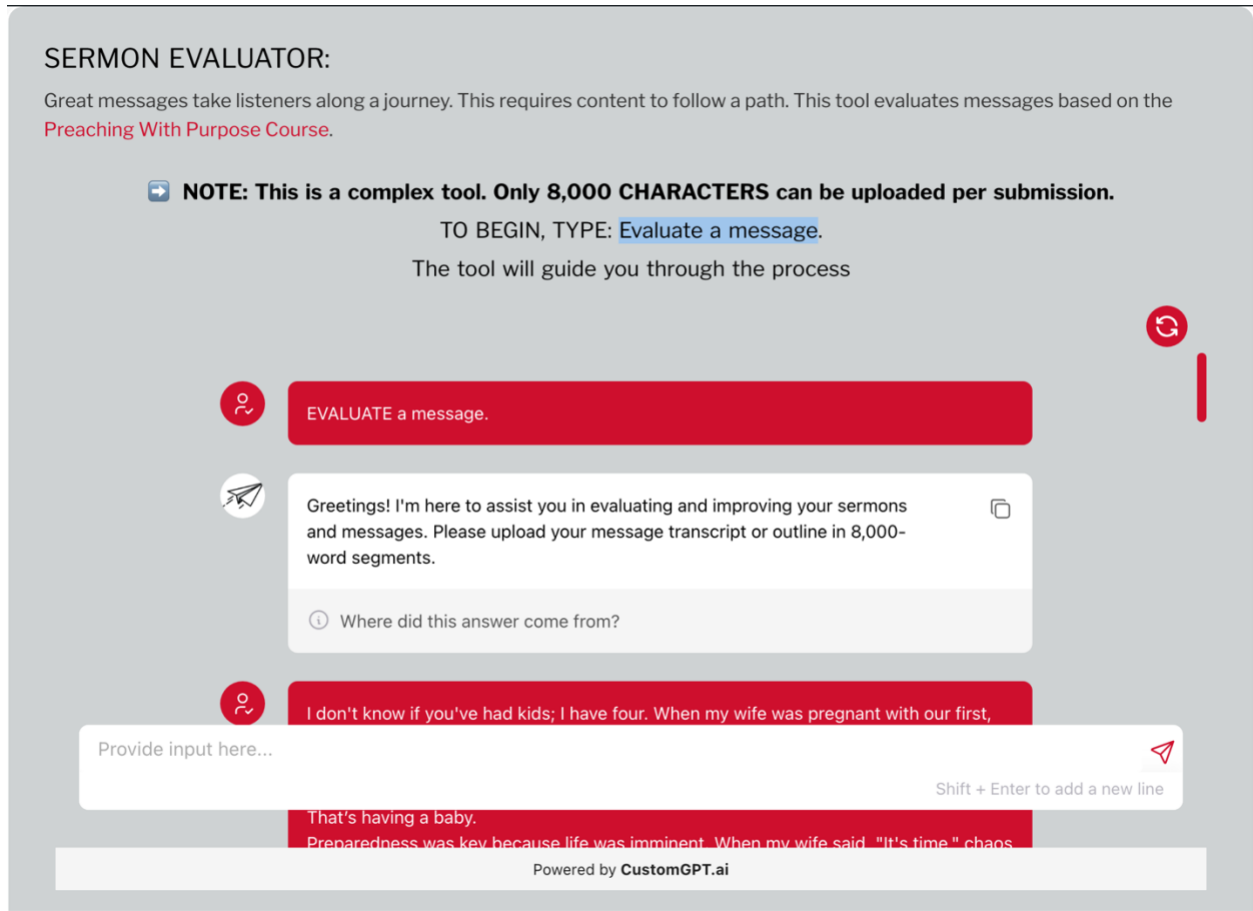

To begin, just type " Evaluate a message" in the prompt and provide a sermon outline or transcript. The below displays the results from a sermon that I uploaded:



The tool will ask you to provide your message transcript or outline in segments. This is a complex and custom tool that works incrementally to provide the most thorough feedback.

Once you confirm your message has been provided in totality, the tool does its magic.
